| Course Description/ Objectives | AP European History is the study of the cultural, economic, political, and social developments that have shaped Europe from c. 1450 to the present. This course prepares students for the AP exam and provides students with the opportunity to earn college credit contingent on passing the AP exam. We will focus on key historical skills and developing our knowledge in European History. In this course students will be required to think actively and deeply about the past. They will transition from being consumers of historical thinking (textbooks \& lectures), to constructing knowledge based on primary, secondary, and tertiary sources. The development of academic argument will be the primary method by which students are assessed in this class. Late Assignments

All assignments are due at the designated time. Homework is due at the beginning of the class hour.

Late assignments due to absences: If a student is absent the day an assignment is due, the student shall receive a due date for the next class meeting.
